There has been some objections and vandalism, however the trees are proving to be a good barrier. The rain has been

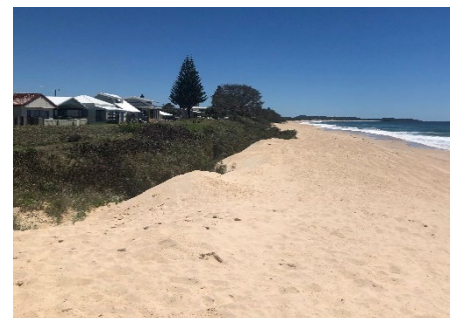

points. Some 4W drivers must have thought the new dune was a great place to drive over, so thank you to Greg Bishop and team for promptly building and

installing sand traps along the South Terrace. We are pruning and planting pigface leaves whenever we are on the beach.
